On Holocaust International Remembrance Day, we had the good fortune of hearing the story of Bram's Violin as told by David Groen in an extraordinary presentation. We learned how a violin belonging to David's uncle, Bram Rodrigues, found its way back to his family 76 years after he was murdered in Auschwitz.

In offering an educational and personal history of his parents' lives leading up to the beginning of the Nazi occupation of Holland, and the events that took place in their city of Amsterdam, David masterfully conveyed with passion his commitment to letting people know how one person's tragic story can bring focus to the horrors of the Holocaust. Accompanied by 8 exceptional performances on the violin by Steffen Zeichner, the presentation had the audience humming and singing along and giving standing ovations for both David's words and Steffen's music.
